2019 Official Launch of Advocacy Bus Tour for Anti-Corruption Education on Campus Cleanie Invites You to Ride With Integrity

To resonate with and to implement the anti-corruption education advocated in the United Nations Convention Against Corruption, and to make others understand the efforts and determination of this Agency in continuously promoting anti-corruption education, the Agency consolidated 30 featured anti-corruption education advocacy plans from all government employee ethics units around Taiwan this year (2019). The Agency also coordinates the "Advocacy Bus Tour for Anti-Corruption Education on Campus." The key visual design of which is based on the form of a bus tour. Together with the representative Cleanie mascot, the bus will drive to places in northern, middle, southern, and eastern Taiwan as well as the outlying islands. The Agency has also chosen to make stops in eight main venues including Taipei City, New Taipei City, Taoyuan City, Taichung City, Tainan City, Kaohsiung City, Taitung County, and Penghu County. At the same time, it will exhibit with the anti-corruption education campus advocacy of each government employee ethics unit around Taiwan and their highlighted culmination. The first stop of this tour (including the launch) was held at the Civic Plaza, New Taipei City today (April

2), which was attended by Deputy Director-General, Jung-Chou Chen, and Deputy Mayor of New Taipei City, Chun-Ching Chen. Deputy Commissioner of the Education Department, New Taipei City, Wei-Min Chiang, Commissioner of the Education Department, Taipei City, Tsan-Chin Tseng and Deputy Commissioner of the Department of Student Affairs and Special Education, Ministry of Education, Tsui-Ying Tsao were also invited to join the announcement of the launch of this series of events by honking the horn in front of the anti-corruption education campus advocacy tour bus.

The launch activity of the first stop invited 500 students from Taipei City, New Taipei City, and Keelung City, and there were 13 delicately designed and coordinated challenging games set up by the government employee ethics units of the Ministry of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Transportation and Communications, Ministry of Finance, Council of Agriculture, Executive Yuan, Ocean Conservation Administration, Ocean Affairs Council, Taipei City Government, New Taipei City Government, Taichung City Government, Kaohsiung City Government, Keelung City Government, Pingtung County Government, Taitung County Government, and Penghu County Government. In addition, there were seven Cleanie mascots, "Yameme", little sea turtle "Strongy", mythical animal "Pro-Baby", the bee "Pi-Po", sunny baby "Windy", "Kao Tong Tong", and the hot-air balloon "T-Baby" who participated in the games and had fun with everyone. We hope the interesting, entertaining, and educational interactions allowed the students understand the true meaning of anti-corruption and integrity.

In the activities to be held in the following stops, the Agency will use our creativity and ideas to collaborate with the relevant resources of activities held in different areas by different agencies in order to integrate anti-corruption and integrity education to the students' daily life.
