## **Cleanies Making Stops Around Taiwan and Invites Children for a Ride**

To resonate with and to implement the anti-corruption education advocated in the United Nations Convention Against Corruption, and to make others understand the efforts and determination in continuously promoting anti-corruption education, the Ministry directed the Agency Against Corruption, Ministry of Justice to consolidate 30 featured anti-corruption education advocacy plans from all government employee ethics units around Taiwan this year (2019) and coordinated the “Advocacy Bus Tour for Anti-Corruption Education on Campus”, the key visual design of which is based on the form of a bus tour. Together with the representative Cleanie mascot, the bus will drive to places in northern, middle, southern, and eastern Taiwan as well as the outlying islands, and the Agency chooses to make stops in eight main venues. To advocate for the importance of anti-corruption education and to expand the promotional effect of the foregoing event, the Minister of Justice, Ching-Hsiang Tsai, invited legal journalists and media for a “ride of integrity” and to interact with Cleanie mascots to experience the highlights delicately planned for the anti-corruption education campus advocacy on April 17.

At the press release, the little robot Zenbo was arranged to introduce the

ocean anti-corruption themed picture book, “The Strike Back of the Little Sea Turtle” co-published by the Agency Against Corruption, Ministry of Justice and Ocean Conservation Administration. The film depicting the launch in Civic Plaza in New Taipei City was participated in by 500 students from Taipei City, New Taipei City, and Keelung City on April 2. In addition to field games which convey the idea of integrity set up by government employee ethics units from all around Taiwan, , There were also seven Cleanie mascots, the “fearless and just” “Yen Gal” representing the Agency Against Corruption, Ministry of Justice, the “fair and environment-conscious” little sea turtle “Strongy” representing the Ocean Conservation Administration, Ocean Affairs Council, the “just and unbiased” mythical animal “Pro-Baby” representing the Taipei City Government, the “diligent and honest” bee “Pi-Po” representing the New Taipei City Government, the “passionate and transparent” sunny baby “Windy” representing the Taichung City Government, the “outgoing and hot-blooded” agricultural genie “High-Passing” representing the Kaohsiung City Government and the “clean and open” hot-air balloon “T-Baby” representing the Taitung County Government in the first activity. The students could experience the importance of anti-corruption and integrity through interesting and education interactive learning.

The anti-corruption education campus advocacy’s highlight activity will be held in the National Museum of Natural Science in Taichung on April 20, 2019, where the “Anti-Corruption Magic School” will be held together with the Science Fair of Taichung City. There will be many diverse science educational games concerning anti-corruption. The “Sea Turtle Release for Conservation” and “Cleaning” the Gailardia Island: Anti-Corruption and Love for the Earth with Beach “Cleaning” will be held on Shili Beach in Penghu on May 29, where ocean conservation advocacy is combined with cleanliness and integrity (less

pollution and less greediness) to create educational synergy. Following that, in Wenhua Elementary School in Taoyuan on June 25, the “Moral Education Calligraphy Competition” and the “Anti-Corruption AI Robot Mascot” will demonstrate that the anti-corruption education can be combined with innovative technology and the shaping of moral character. On September 11, in Taitung County Stadium, the anti-corruption mascot, hot balloon “T-Baby” will lead students to speak out loud vocabulary relating to anti-corruption such as just, fairness, honesty, and non-greediness in indigenous languages. They will demonstrate the self-confidence and energy of anti-corruption and integrity. On September 17, the “Anti-Corruption Flute Player Following Integrity” will be held in the Sihwei Administrative Center of Kaohsiung City Government. The concept of anti-corruption and integrity will be introduced to the intelligent riddle games of room escape by design, so that students may understand the true value of anti-corruption and integrity in the process of trying to solve difficult problems of the game. In late September, in the Taipei City Library, by collaborating with the storytelling of the “Children’s Integrity Month” and anti-corruption animation, the aim of internalizing anti-corruption education will be achieved through a visual feast. The last event in early October will be held on the plaza stage of the Tainan Culture Center, which combines anti-corruption and integrity teaching proposals, booklet design and creation, performance of speaking integrity in English, and “Painting an Ancient City With Integrity”, where the integrity in the mind of students in the Ancient City will be depicted.

In addition to the above major events, in 2019, the Agency Against Corruption, Ministry of Justice consolidates campus advocacy resources for anti-corruption education of all institutions in Taiwan to integrate the concept of anti-corruption and integrity into students’ daily learning activities. It is estimated that there are 1,330 anti-corruption education advocacy events under

30 programs, where about 80,000 students and parents will join. The Ministry of Justice sincerely invites you to join our efforts in creating a clean and transparent environment with integrity.
