

Results of Administrative Corruption Investigation by Agency Against Corruption (AAC) of the Ministry of Justice (MOJ)

Data Period: 3rd quarters of 2023
Jul. - Sept.

To meet the public's expectations for anti-corruption work and increase trust in the government, the Agency Against Corruption (AAC), Ministry of Justice, directed government employee ethics units of different levels to take disciplinary actions against public servants who: are being investigated for illegal activities, have committed administrative violations, or have violated the Integrity and Ethics Direction for Public Servants for non-corruption crimes. The purpose of such efforts is to prevent corruption by ensuring public servants' legal awareness and compliance with the law.

For 3rd quarters of 2023, AAC handled in total 33 cases of administrative corruption investigation. Regarding the categories of offenses, there were 2 cases of Immigration and Coast Guard, 4 cases of Healthcare, 1 case of Education, 1 case of River and Gravel Management, 4 cases of Environmental Protection, 1 case of Police Department, 3 cases of Civil Affairs, Household Registration, Military Service and Land Administration, 1 case of Judicial Affairs, 3 cases of State-Owned Enterprises; 4 cases of Transportation, Tourism and Weather, 3 cases of Administrative Affairs, 1 case of Highway, Road and Motor Vehicles Supervision, 1 case of Agriculture, Forestry, Fishery and Animal Husbandry, 2 cases of Legal Affairs, 1 case of National Property Management, and 1 case of Others.

Official Ranks of the Staff Disciplined: 5 senior staff, 29 associate staff, 12 junior staff, and 27 contract and hired staff, with a total of 73 persons;

Disciplinary Punishment: Dismissal (including dismissal and suspension) to 2 persons, adjustment of position to 3 person, demerits to 22 persons, reprimand to 40 persons, and written (oral) warning to 8 persons.
