If you work at the agency responsible for receiving whistleblowing reports






You must issue an investigation notification to the whistleblower within 20 days after receiving the report





You must issue an investigation results notification to the whistleblower within 6 months after receiving the report





Where the agency receiving the report determines that it does not have jurisdiction, it must transfer the case to the agency with jurisdiction and notify the whistleblower





The contents of reports must be kept confidential





Civil servants who leak the identity of a whistleblower without a justifiable reason shall be punished with imprisonment for a term of no less than 6 months and no more than 5 years. In addition, a fine of up to NT\$300,000 may be imposed



Civil servants who leak the identity of a whistleblower due to negligence shall be punished with imprisonment for a term of no more than 1 year, detention, and/or a fine of up to NT\$100,000.



Non-civil servants who leak the identity of a whistleblower without a justifiable reason shall be punished with imprisonment for a term of no more than 1 year, detention, and/or a fine of up to NT\$100.000

The identity of whistleblowers may not be disclosed without the consent of the whistleblower






You must investigate the whistleblowing case





You may require the whistleblower or the implicated enterprise, the agency (institution), or other related parties to provide supporting evidence and cooperate with the investigation





To preserve evidence, you may ask the court to seize items before judgment



Conduct investigations according to responsibilities and implement confidentiality measures.
