

Results of Administrative Corruption

Investigation by Agency Against Corruption

(AAC) of the Ministry of Justice (MOJ)

Data Period: 2nd quarter of 2026

To meet the public's expectations for anti-corruption work and increase trust in the government, the Agency Against Corruption (AAC), Ministry of Justice, directed government employee ethics units of different levels to take disciplinary actions against public servants who: are being investigated for illegal activities, have committed administrative violations, or have violated the Integrity and Ethics Direction for Public Servants for non-corruption crimes. The purpose of such efforts is to prevent corruption by ensuring public servants' legal awareness and compliance with the law.

For 2nd quarter of 2026, AAC handled in total 19 cases of administrative corruption investigation. Regarding the categories of offenses, there were 1 case of Customs Affairs, 1 case of Fire Department, 1 case of Healthcare , 1 case of Civil Affairs, Household Registration, Military Service and Land Administration,5 cases of Police Department, 2 cases of Immigration and Coast Guard,2 cases of Environmental Protection, 2 cases of Administrative Affairs, and 4 cases of Others.

Official Ranks of the Staff Disciplined: 2 senior staff, 15 associate staff, 7 junior staff, and 9 contract and hired staff, with a total of 33 persons;

Disciplinary Punishment: Dismissal (including dismissal and suspension) to 1 person, adjustment of position to 2 persons, demerit to 13 persons, reprimand to 14 persons, and others to 6 persons.
