## Illegal Affairs of Building Modification in the Kaohsiung Haung Pu Military Dependents' Village Investigated by Agency Against Corruption has been Convicted by the Taiwan Kaohsiung District Court.

14 people, including Lieutenant Colonel Chang () of the Military
Dependents Serving Office of the Ministry of National Defense,
Major Kao $\bigcirc\bigcirc$ of the Military Dependents Service Group of the $\bigcirc$
Army Command, Wang OO, borough chief of OOVillage of
Fengshan District Kaohsiung City, and Su $\bigcirc\bigcirc$ of the military
dependent village, were suspected of being involved in using the
opportunity to overstate the area of illegal structures when the Haung
Pu Military Dependents Village in Kaohsiung was modified ,in order
to obtain a higher relocation compensation fee.

The case, after being transferred by Southern Investigation Office of Agency Against Corruption(AAC) to the Kaohsiung District Prosecutors Office for investigation and persecution, was convicted by the Kaohsiung District Court on August 1, 2016. According to bribery offense contrary to jobs specified in Subparagraph 5, Paragraph 1 of Article 1 of the Anti-Corruption Act, the sentences are as follows: Kao 

was sentenced to six years and eight months of imprisonment, six years deprivation of civil rights and confiscation of NT\$5,160,000

in criminal proceeds; Zhang  $\bigcirc$  was sentenced to three years imprisonment along with three years of deprivation of civil rights, furthermore criminal proceeds of NT\$ 55,000 were confiscated. The other 11 people, including military dependent Su $\bigcirc$ , were sentenced ranging from one year and nine months to three years and ten months in accordance with the provisions stipulated in Subparagraph 2, Paragraph 1 of Article 5 of the Anti-Corruption Act. Criminal proceeds of NT\$ 5,772,816 were confiscated.
