Results of Administrative Corruption Investigation by Agency Against Corruption (AAC) of the Ministry of Justice (MOJ)

Data Period: 2nd quarter of 2025

Apr. – Jun.

To meet the public's expectations for anti-corruption work and increase trust in the government, the Agency Against Corruption (AAC), Ministry of Justice, directed government employee ethics units of different levels to take disciplinary actions against public servants who: are being investigated for illegal activities, have committed administrative violations, or have violated the Integrity and Ethics Direction for Public Servants for non-corruption crimes. The purpose of such efforts is to prevent corruption by ensuring public servants' legal awareness and compliance with the law.

For 2nd quarter of 2025, AAC handled in total 25 cases of administrative corruption investigation. Regarding the categories of offenses, there were 2 cases of Legal Affairs, 2 cases of Healthcare, 1 case of Social Welfare, 1 case of Fire Department, 1 case of Highway, Road and Motor Vehicles Supervision, 1 case of Transportation, Tourism and Weather, 5 cases of Police Department, 4 cases of Environmental Protection, 1 case of River and Gravel Management, 1 case of Construction, 1 case of Administrative Affairs, 2 cases of Civil Affairs, Household Registration, Military Service and Land Asministration, 1 case of State-Owned Enterprises, 1 case of Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Animal Husbandry, and 1 case of Others.

Official Ranks of the Staff Disciplined: 7 senior staff, 17associate staff, 24 junior staff, and 15 contract and hired staff, with a total of 63 persons;

Disciplinary Punishment: Dismissal (including dismissal and suspension) to 5 persons, Adjustment of Position to 9 persons, demerit to 36 persons, reprimand to 11 persons, and Others to 4 persons.
